IOCC Charity Opportunity

International Orthodox Christian Charities (IOCC) offers emergency relief and development programs to those in need worldwide. On January 29th, during the parish assembly, the children of the parish will help to assemble health and hygiene kits to donate to IOCC to distribute worldwide. This is a great opportunity for the children of our parish to get involved and do something tangible to help others. We need donations to help build the kits and a bin will be set up in the parish hall for collection. Items needed include:

- One-gallon plastic bags with a zipper closure
- Cotton hand towels (no fingertip, bath, dish towel or microfiber)
- Cotton washcloths (no microfiber)
- Wide-tooth combs
- Fingernail or toenail clippers
- Bath-size bars of soap in the wrapper
- Toothbrushes in the package
- Standard size Band-Aids

Total Charity Collections for 2022

Thanks to your generous donations, our parish was able to raise close to \$1,800 for Fishline's Christmas Child Campaign. This means we were able to help roughly 36 families buy presents and holiday meals for their families this year. In addition, we collected and donated two large food bins during the Nativity Fast. Thank you so much for your support of these two programs offered through Fishline, which help our local community.

In addition, here is a breakdown of all charity donations in our parish for 2022:

- Kitsap Homes of Compassion: \$817

Women's Fellowship

This acquisition moves us from the image of God to the likeness of God; through our obedience to this call we begin to know God and this knowledge is eternal life (John 17:3). This small book hopes to begin to answer how acquiring the Mind of Christ is possible and why it is necessary in our lives today."




