

Eastern Wall Iconography

Brian Whirledge—who painted our two new veneration icons of Christ and the Theotokos—has confirmed that he will be visiting our parish in February to paint the new icons that we have been eagerly awaiting for our eastern wall. These icons will include the Mother of God of the Sign on the upper register, and the Communion of the Apostles on the lower register behind the altar table.

Brian will be staying with us for two or three weeks as he undertakes this work. During that time, we will have scaffolding in place along the wall, so try not to be distracted by it! A sketch of the new iconography is pinned to our bulletin board is pictured below.

Services of Forgiveness Sunday & Clean Week

February culminates this year with the beginning of Great Lent on February 27th. Everyone should plan to attend Forgiveness Sunday Vespers on Sunday, February 26th at 1:30 p.m., following our coffee fellowship. The Great Fast officially begins following that service.

We do not have a choir to serve Great Compline, but we will still undertake to sing the Great Penitential Canon of Saint Andrew of Crete during the course of the first week of the fast (Clean Week). The Great Canon will be celebrated Monday, February 27th through Thursday, March 2nd at 6:30 p.m. Our choir will be present for the Presanctified Divine Liturgy on Friday, March 3rd at 6:30 p.m., a wonderful way to complete Clean Week.

IOCC Charity Update

Parish Assembly Recap

We held our all-parish assembly on Sunday, January 29th. If you missed it, below is a recap:

Pastor's Report

Our temple saw a lot of improvements in 2022. We installed beautiful custom wood chandeliers, designed and built by Gordy in coordination with Grier. We purchased new hand-painted veneration icons of Christ and the Theotokos, now housed in cherrywood kiots generously made by Mike Lindsey. We hung twelve new menaion icons across the western wall. And we contracted for new iconography on our eastern and western walls, with icons of the Theotokos and Apostles.

2022 also saw a lot of changes in our parish membership. We lost 30 members, mostly due to relocations, including the Ferrenbergs and the Hickmans for much of the year. We lost Patti Large and Vern Peterson (Memory Eternal!). This represents a loss of about 25 percent of our membership—the most in recent history. But we also welcomed 30 new members! Our parish is now composed of an increasing percentage of newer members; only 25 percent were here eight years ago


In addition to our new members, we are blessed with many new catechumens—Josh and Allison Toth, Mike Lindsey, John Olson, Chris and Grace Bynum, and Vic Peri.

Father John reminded us that membership numbers are not the only way to measure parish growth. It is just as important—and indeed, more so—for us to grow in our faith. We should all attend liturgical services regularly, including Saturday vespers at least once a month; engage in charitable outreach; and bear witness to the faith. We are blessed with many visitors and inquirers. They need to encounter an active parish and experience the love of Christ through us. That is how our parish will grow.

Western Wall Iconography

In addition to our new eastern wall iconography in February, our new western wall iconography is scheduled to be installed during the summer of 2023.

Below is a sketch of the plan for our western wall—a large icon of the Dormition of the Theotokos flanked by icons of Old-Testament typologies of the Theotokos (the burning bush and Jacob's ladder).



New Choir Director

Two of our new members are Christine and Mike Adam, who travel more than two hours each way to be with us and direct our choir on Saturdays and Sundays. Our parish could not be more grateful to Christine and Mike for their sacrifice and help!

Treasurer's Report & 2023 Budget

Nancy Conrad gave the Treasurer's Report. With so many departures in 2022, there was a great risk that we would be in financial straits. But with many new members and generous gifts, our 2023 income is projected to be only \$15,000 less than last year. The budget was passed with only minor differences in expenditures from last year!

Parish Ministries & History

Suzanna Jefferis recently completed her report documenting the history of our parish and shows how we have sought to fulfill various ministries over the years. This is an important project to capture knowledge about our history before it is lost. If you would like a copy of Suzanna's report, please email Father John. Elections

With Grier's term ending, Suzanna Jefferis accepted her nomination to serve as the newest member of the Parish Council. Francis Spillane will be the alternate should a vacancy occur this year.

Sheryl Lawson will be our lay representative at this year's diocesan assembly in October. Roxanne Bennet will be the alternate.

New Alaskan Clergy Charity

On the first Sunday of each month, we collect for one of four rotating charities. This year, we voted to replace one of them (Fishline) with a new charitable collection for the Alaska Clergy Stipend Endowment. Donations to this endowment are needed to remedy seriously impoverished living conditions of clergy in the Diocese of Sitka and Alaska—the root of Orthodoxy in America. Our first monthly collection for this new charity will be Sunday, April 2, 2023. Our parish will also be donating \$200 per month to this charity out of our general fund.

Charity Sunday

February 5th – We will be collecting this month for Kitsap Homes of Compassion, a local charity working to find housing for those in need. If you forget your checkbook on Charity Sunday, you can always make a donation later in the month. Just write "charity" in the memo line of your check.

Last month, we collected \$649 for our inparish charity fund. Thank you for your generous donations!

Bookstore News

This month we have a new title in our bookstore—*Money & Salvation: An Invitation to the Good Way* by Andrew Galeris. From the Ancient Faith website:

"Too often, we as hierarchs, clergy, and lay leaders speak to our people about giving to meet the needs of the Church or the needs of the poor, and we forget to teach that the true need for each and every one of us is simply to give. God did not recommend that we give only when there is some perceived need or a capital campaign for a project. God commands that we give for our salvation. This short but profound book explores the deeper spiritual meaning—and necessity—of financial giving."

We also have several new prayer ropes from Kodiak, Alaska, and several titles in stock for Lent, including *The Lenten Triodion*, *The Lenten Spring*, *Great Lent: Journey to Pascha*, and *Meditations for Great Lent*.
