Our parish's hosting of the film *Sacred Alaska* occurred last month with an excellent turnout. We sold out Kingston's Firehouse Theater and needed additional space in the adjacent overflow theater. We had 126 in attendance, a large percentage of whom were guests of parishioners; and by appearances several attendees learned about the screening on their own. At the showing and after, we raised more than \$4000 for the Matushka Xenia Oleksa fund. We would like to thank again those who put so much work into making this event possible.

#### **Lenten Confessions**

To receive holy communion at Pascha and beyond, it is necessary for each grown member of the parish to make at least one sacramental confession during the course of the Fast. As always, Father John is available

## Changes to Men's & Women's Fellowship Schedules.

Our parish's men's fellowship has been meeting every other Saturday morning, but during April we will transition to a new schedule of meeting every first and third Saturday at 9:00 a.m. The purpose of this change is to accommodate the women's fellowship, which will move its meetings from Tuesday evenings to the second Saturday of every month at 10:00 a.m.

For the men's fellowship, this will not change the April schedule, but going forward participants should keep an eye on the calendar to confirm the meetings.

#### Men's Fellowship

The men's fellowship will be meeting this month on Saturday, April 6<sup>th</sup> and Saturday, April 20<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. During our meeting on April 6<sup>th</sup> we will begin discussing our new book, Fr. Alexander Schmemann's *Great Lent* (the first three chapters). All men in the parish—and women, too—are welcome and encouraged to join in the reading together of this illuminating work.

#### Women's Fellowship

The Women's Group will meet on Saturday, April 13<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 to 11:30 a.m. Please join us to discuss this month's topic: *What is the Great Fast like in real life?* You are

welcome to share your experiences as well as any wisdom you have gleaned from the scriptures or writings of the fathers and saints.

We will continue to meet the second Saturday of each month, and welcome all women in our parish to join us. If you have small children and would like to join, we can arrange for a sitter as well, at the church.

# Two New Charity Opportunities

#### New Day Ministry

New Day Ministry is an all-volunteer nonprofit organization that has been providing services for our low-income Kitsap neighbors since 2016. New Day Ministry serves people experiencing homelessness, people experiencing poverty, seniors, families with children, and those recovering from addiction in Kitsap County.

They provide a safe, judgment-free place with hot meals and groceries and offer 12-step classes while providing other basic needs for those who are hungry and hopeless.

Meals are served every Tuesday and Thursday at 5:00 p.m. Volunteers are asked to get there between 4:00 and 4:30 p.m. If you would like to help serve meals, please fill out an application found here.

#### Bremerton Prayer Walk

Bremerton Prayer Walk is an all-inclusive group of people bringing love, light and hope to the streets of Bremerton. The group gathers together to distribute supplies and food to the homeless every second and fourth Saturday of the month. The walk starts at the Marvin Williams Center at 725 Park Avenue in Bremerton, beginning at 9:00 a.m. and ending at 11:00 a.m. Suzanna Jefferis and Jamie Telegin recently joined them and it was a wonderful experience.

There are several ways for our parish to support this amazing group:

1. Donating and putting together packets of food to distribute to the homeless: We will be placing a collection bin in the Parish Hall with a flyer depicting needed pre-packaged food items, to be bagged into individual packets for handing out. The bin will be collected on Wednesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>. If you are interesting in helping Jamie assemble the bags please let her know and we can

assemble them together before the Presanctified Divine Liturgy.

- 2. Donations to go towards the purchase of backpacks, collapsible wagons, and fanny packs. During our walk with the group, we learned that having a way to carry items is in high demand but these items can be costly and many are needed. We can help support them in their efforts by taking up a donation specifically for this need.
- 3. Providing weather appropriate clothing. Please donate one to two nicer, gently used, clothing items appropriate for Spring. Men's clothing is in higher demand and pants especially.
- 4. Finally, please join us on April 13<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. for the prayer walk. We have offered to help the group collect trash and hand out supplies. The group parks at the Marvin Convention Center and walks from there.
