New Barrel Vault Iconography

Our parish council has now contracted with iconographer Brian Whirledge for a full length icon for our barrel vault ceiling. The project will cost \$35,100, of which we have already sent a down payment of \$10,530 and collected an additional \$3,000 in donations and pledges. This leaves a remaining balance of \$21,750.

Livestreaming Services

We have completed our new internet system at the church enabling us to provide quality live streaming of services. It is important to remember two things about watching services online. The first is that it is offered as a ministry for parishioners who due to



health limitations (such as being sick during a given service) cannot attend. In this case it cannot be an alternative to being present with the assembly of the Body of Christ and participating in the sacraments. Second, it is offered as a ministry for non- parishioners—especially non-Orthodox—who want to learn about the Orthodox Church's worship and our parish. Removal of Metal Container & Parking


Parishioners should be aware that we have had occasional difficulty backing out of the main parking lot on Sundays. Please be sure to park in the second row with enough space for the first row along the fence line. There is an overflow section of parking on the other side of the church building when needed.

If you look to the north of our building you will notice that the metal container that once littered the property has now been removed. We own the half-acre it stood on, which is now available for overflow parking. It may also be used some day for the expansion of our facilities.
